Nevada UCR Definitions / Explanations

Uniform Crime Reporting Program

The UCR program is a nationwide, cooperative, statistical effort by over 17,000 city, county and state law enforcement agencies that voluntarily report data on crimes brought to their attention. Law enforcement agencies active in the national program represent 95% of the total population of the United States. While the program's primary objective is to generate a reliable set of crime statistics for use in law enforcement administration, operation and management, its data has over the years become one of the country's leading social indicators.

In Nevada, 36 agencies are currently reporting UCR data to the statewide program representing nearly 99% of its population. Rather than submitting directly to the FBI, local agencies must submit crime data to the state UCR Repository, which compiles, analyzes and submits copies of the reports to the FBI. The Nevada UCR Program prides itself on its responsiveness to local contributing agencies that previously received limited feedback for their efforts. The Nevada program is also responsible for producing and distributing periodic reports of the information contained in its database. As its database has grown, the program's utility has become even more apparent.

Eight offenses serve as an index for gauging fluctuations in overall volumes and rates of crime. Known collectively as the " Crime Index, " these offenses include *the violent crimes of murder, rape, robbery and assault and the property crimes of burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson*. These offenses were selected as a grouped measuring device because they represent the most common crime problems. They are all serious crimes; either by their very nature or due to the volume and frequency with which they occur.

Index Crimes Definitions

Murder and Non-negligent Manslaughter

Murder and non negligent manslaughter, as defined in the Uniform Crime Reporting Program, is the willful (non-negligent) killing of a human being by another.

The classification of this offense, as for all other Crime Index offenses, is based solely on police investigation as opposed to the determination of a court, medical examiner, coroner, jury or other judicial entity. Not included in the count for this offense classification are deaths caused by negligence, suicide or accident, justifiable homicides and attempts to murder or assaults to murder. These are scored as aggravated assaults.

Nevada UCR Definitions / Explanations

Forcible Rape

Forcible rape, as defined in the program, is the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Assaults or attempts to commit rape by force or threat of force are also included; however, statutory rape (without force) and other sex offenses are excluded.

Robbery

Robbery is the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

Aggravated Assault

Aggravated assault is an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault is usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. Attempts are included since it is not necessary that an injury result when a gun, knife or other weapon is used which could and probably would result in serious personal injury if the crime were successfully completed

Burglary

The Uniform Crime Reporting Program defines burglary as the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft. The use of force to gain entry is not required to classify an offense as burglary. Burglary in this program is categorized into three sub classifications: forcible entry, unlawful entry where no force is used and attempted forcible entry.

Larceny-Theft

Larceny-theft is the unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. It includes crimes such as shoplifting, pocket picking, purse-snatching, thefts from motor vehicles, thefts of motor vehicle parts and accessories, and bicycle thefts, etc., in which no use of force, violence, or fraud occurs. In the UCR Program, this crime category does not include embezzlement, "con" games, forgery, and worthless checks. Motor vehicle theft is also excluded from this category inasmuch as it is a separate Crime Index offense.

Motor Vehicle Theft

Defined as the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle, this offense category includes the stealing of automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, motor scooters, snowmobiles, etc. The definition excludes the taking of a motor vehicle for temporary use by those persons having lawful access.

Nevada UCR

Definitions / Explanations

Arson

Arson is defined by the Uniform Crime Reporting Program as any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, a motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc. Only fires determined through investigation to have been willfully or maliciously set are classified as arsons. Fires of suspicious or unknown origins are excluded.

Population Estimates

State, county and incorporated city population estimates are prepared and reviewed prior to the end of each calendar year for certification by the governor by March 1. The Nevada Department of Taxation and Nevada State Demographer, Bureau of Business and Economic Research, College of Business Administration, University of Nevada, Reno, prepares these estimates.

Crime Rates

Crime rates involve the number of Index Crimes per unit of population, usually per 100,000 persons. Because Nevada has such a low population, a rate per 1,000 persons is used to reflect a more realistic volume. No attempt is made to incorporate transient populations or other factors that contribute to the ratio and types of crime in given areas. Any effort to make comparisons of crime rates between areas should be tempered by these population and environmental variables.

Crime rates are one of the most meaningful statistical elements. Computation of crime rates per 1,000 population is achieved by dividing the community's population by 1,000, then dividing the number of offenses in each class by that number. The answer is the number of offenses per 1,000 population and is the crime rate for that particular offense. In Table 2, the County Total Crime Rate is computed after subtracting the population figure for all non-reporting agencies for the current month.

The index offense "Aggravated Assault" is an item of special interest to users of Nevada's UCR report. In Tables 1 & 3, where Nevada and National crime rates are compared, "simple assaults" are subtracted from the total of all assaults following FBI UCR rules, thus allowing for direct comparison. However, total assaults (simple and aggravated) are also presented in the Nevada report. This is because the Nevada UCR staff believes this figure is an important indicator of risk for citizens and it presents a more balanced picture of this portion of the crime index to law enforcement personnel.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation, Uniform Crime Reporting Section, publishes national rates.

Clearance Rates

The percentage of crimes cleared is obtained by dividing the number of offenses cleared by the number of offenses known. This number is then multiplied by 100.

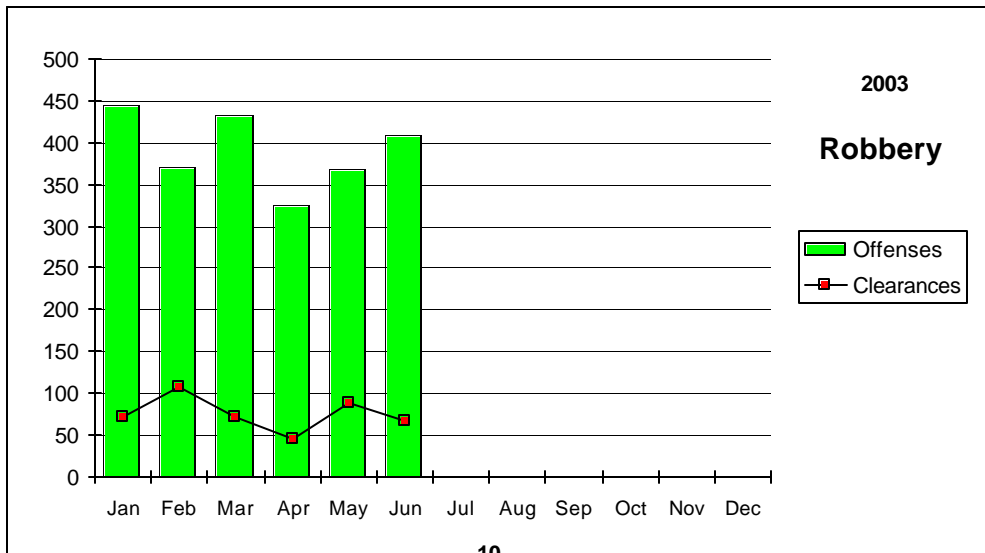
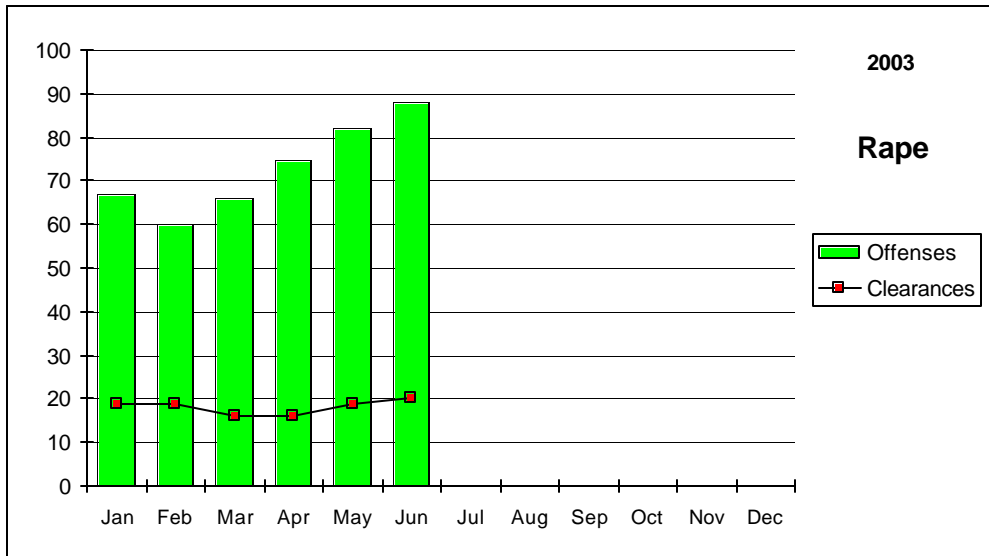
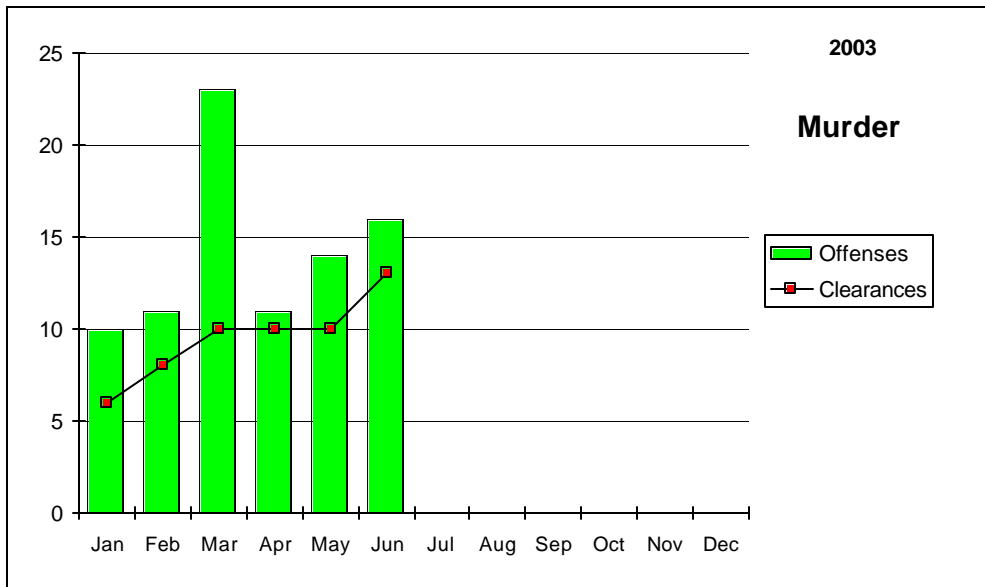

Nevada (Projected 2004) vs National (2002) Crime Clearance Rates

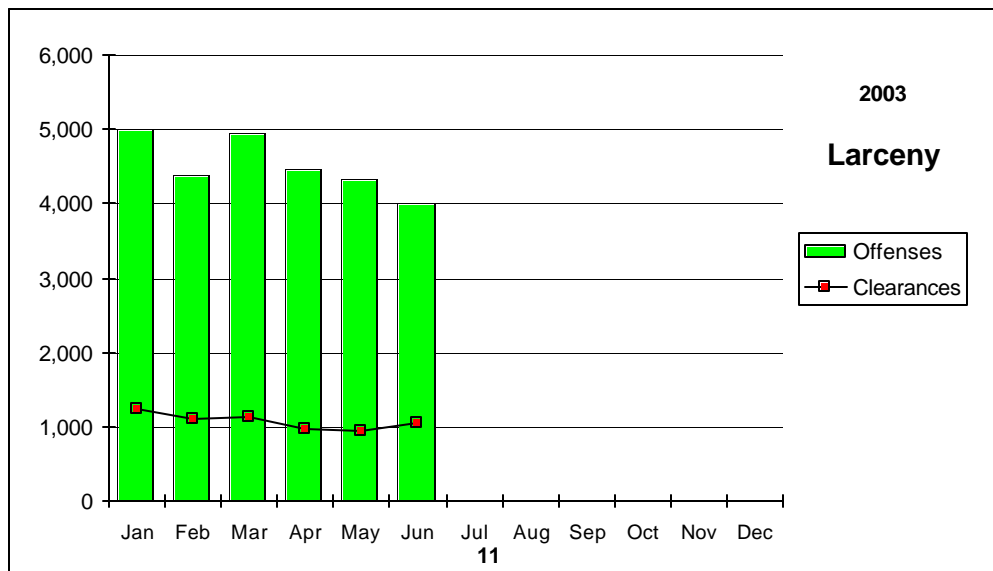
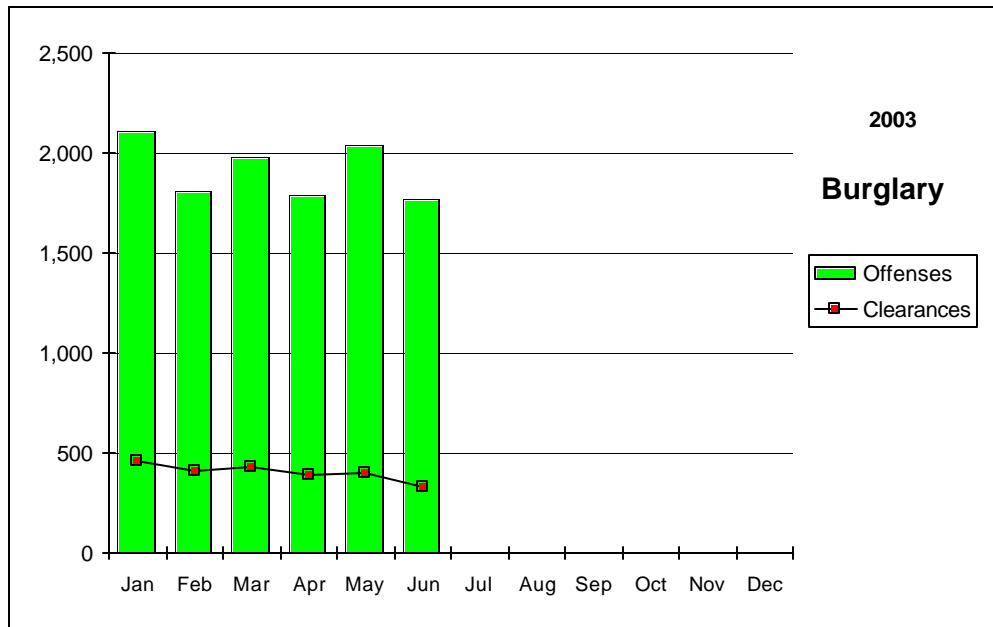
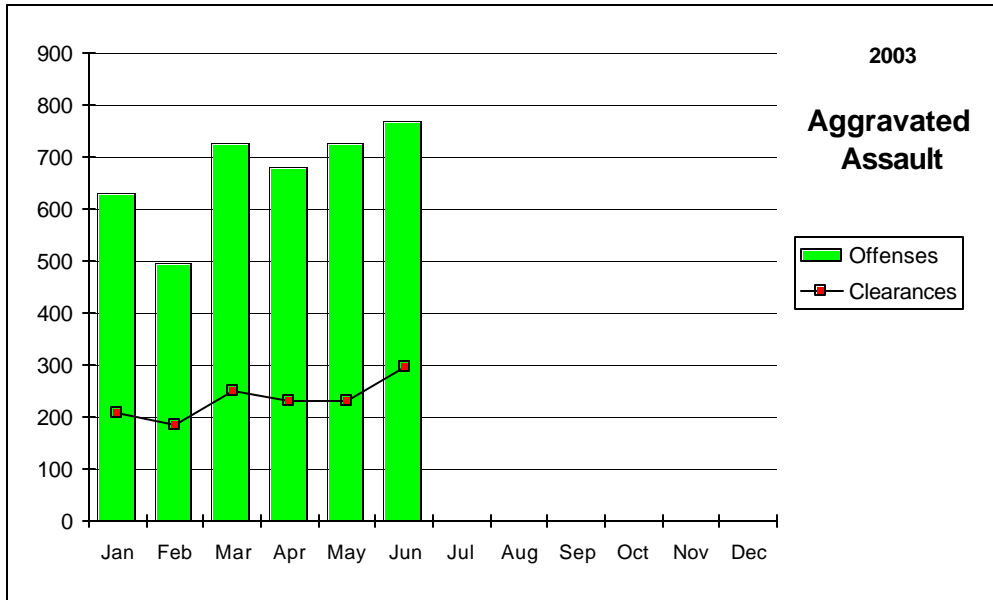

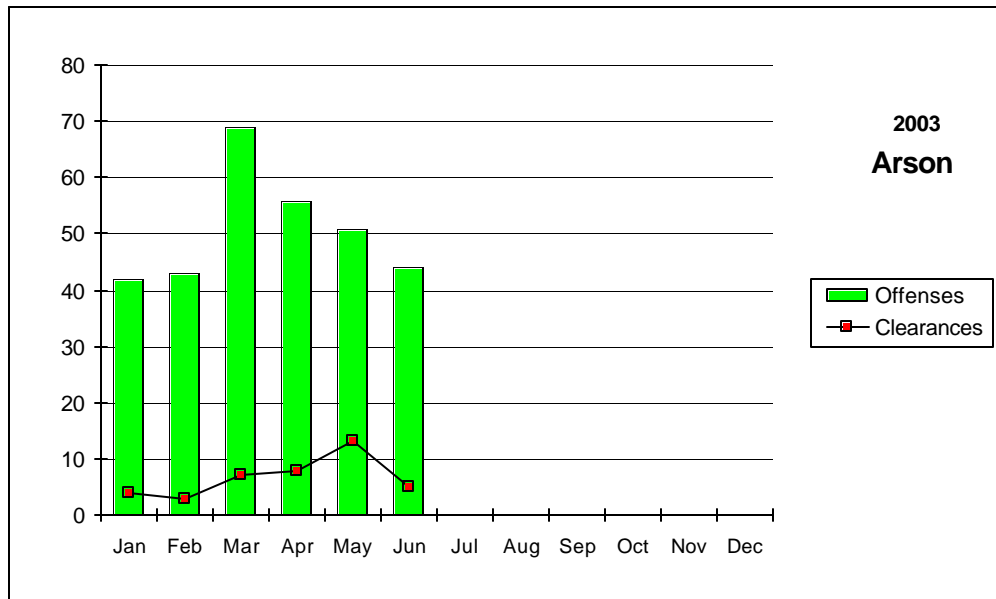
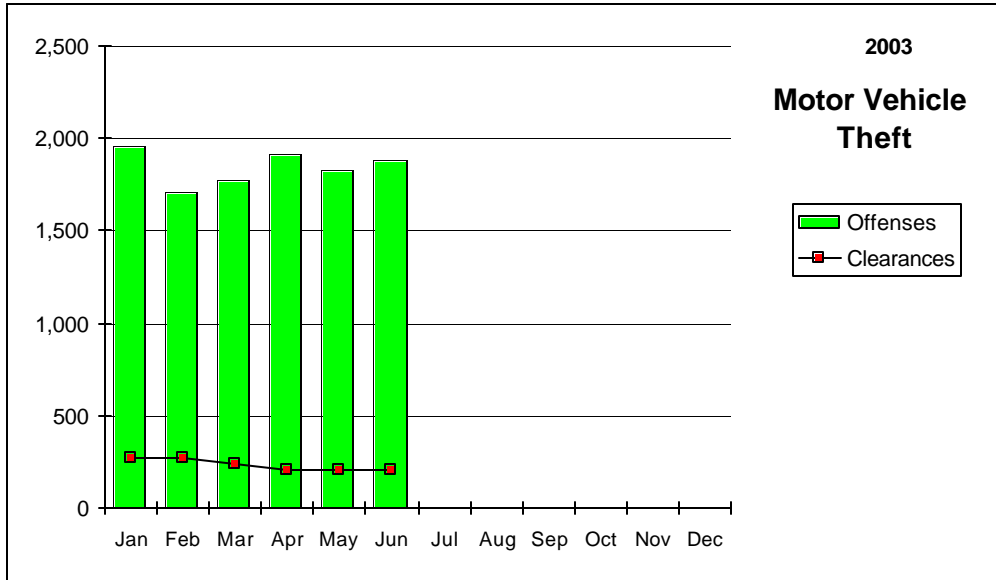
Nevada--Graphic Summary--UCR
